


**JOINT STATEMENT OF PURPOSE BETWEEN
THE FEDERAL AVIATION ADMINISTRATION
AND THE EMPRESA ARGENTINA DE NAVEGACIÓN AÉREA S.E.**

The Argentine Republic Empresa Argentina de Navegación Aérea S.E. (EANA) and the United States Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) share a common interest in the provision of safe, efficient, and modernized air navigation services, and the advancement of civil aviation in Latin America. There are areas of mutual interest between the EANA and FAA that can benefit from a cooperative dialogue. Starting with this joint Statement of Purpose, the EANA and FAA intend to work together to establish a forum for discussion and collaboration with emphasis on regional growth and best practices.

The Empresa Argentina de Navegación Aérea S.E., founded upon the principles of operational safety, has a double challenge: to support the strong increase in air traffic as well as to meet projected growth in the near term. As the newly established air navigation service provider, EANA performs its key role of facilitator of air traffic growth by rapidly moving towards implementation of an investment plan and training its staff to meet its present needs. EANA aims to be self-sustained and to plan, organize and develop the air navigation service through constant enhancement. EANA is firmly committed to service quality and overall efficiency of the air transport system.

As the world's largest air navigation service provider, the FAA is committed to reaching the next level of safety, efficiency, environmental responsibility and global leadership. To achieve this commitment, the FAA is implementing the Next Generation Air Transportation System (NextGen) as well as continuing a legacy of excellence in air navigation services and safety oversight.

With the signing of this statement, the EANA and FAA express a shared interest in dialogue and the exchange of information in areas such as operational efficiency, technical advancements, safety management, and technical training. Through bilateral, regional, and global forums such as the Civil Air Navigation Services Organization (CANSO), an open and productive dialogue between the EANA and the FAA in these areas of mutual interest will serve to promote future cooperation in a way that will benefit the Latin American region and the global aviation community.
